SUMMER HEALTH TIPS:

HEAT-HYDRATION-HEAT STROKE-SUN POISONING:


Heat exhaustion results in nausea, vomiting, fatigue, weakness, headaches, muscle cramps, dizziness. Heat stroke occurs when the bodies temperature gets too high, the person quits sweating, red/flushed dry skin, confused, agitated. Death occurs when breathing stops and heart stops.

How to treat if you suspect someone with heat exhaustion: Have them lay down, elevate their feet, turn fan on them on low to help cool them down, give water or sports drink to rehydrate, apply cool (not ice cold) compress on forehead, armpits.

Sun Poisoning: This is a case of severe sunburn that results in blistering, chills, headache, hot skin, red inflamed skin that is painful and tingling, thirst with feeling like you can't get enough to drink-dehydration. How to treat sun poisoning: Get out of the sun and <u>stay</u> out of the sun. If you must go out, wear a long sleeve cool cotton shirt to protect your skin from further damage. Drink water or sports drinks to get and stay hydrated. Apply an aloe spray to cool the burn, take Tylenol for the pain, take a cool (not cold) shower and apply a cool compress for added comfort.

Enjoy your summer!!!

Please keep in mind that certain medications will cause you to sunburn very quickly and severely. Read the labels or ask your pharmacist/physician.



SPOTLIGHT ON MINISTRY The council has decided to honor and spotlight a ministry of
