

Plans for the ramp access to the fellowship hall on the western side of the rear of the church.

At our May council meeting it was decided to engage the services of Gary Grimm, architect of Carlson Construction, Inc. to design a handicapped accessible entrance to the fellowship hall. Gary was the architect who actually designed our Education Building in 1972. After several meetings and consultations we have been given his design and an estimate of cost from our builder, Stence's Contracting. Drawings are included in this letter for your viewing. At the congregational meeting held last November the congregation voted to authorize the council to proceed with this project (according to the constitution projects of such size need a congregational vote). In fact, the congregation voted on the plan submitted from the property committee, which authorized the council to proceed with some priority projects that would all relate to the David & Erla Gerhard bequest for building and grounds improvements.

Some projects have been completed (new bathroom in the fellowship hall, energy system upgrades, etc.). The north side of the church has been redesigned in preparation for this new handicapped accessible ramp. After the ramp and some other small projects we will have completed nearly everything on our list of improvements. It was decided to keep a \$50,000 portion of the Gerhard bequest for an emergency reserve in the building fund.

The only sizable project that was on the list of improvements and will remain there until sufficient funds are available is the addition of air conditioning in the church building. The council has asked that we begin a funding campaign to raise the necessary funds for this project without using the reserve about from the Gerhard estate. Most of the estimates gathered for a project like this were nearly \$48,000. If you would like to contribute to such a fund please contact the office so that the donations can be properly applied to a reserve fund for this purpose.



In the past, improvements like this were funded in small amounts of time. In the late 1980's the organ was refurbished for more then \$40,000 and the funds were raised from member donations alone in only one year's time. Pray for the continued blessing we have here at Salem, that we can continue to grow and improve worship space.

Smaller projects are still underway including the improvement of railings around the church, the gothic arch roof over the sacristy entrance, and the refurbishment of the fellowship hall bathroom!

Thanks be to God for faithful servants like David and Erla and their foresight in naming the church in their estate planning.



The most significant part of our education program is a strong desire to prepare our children to understand the church and why it is significant in a world that so quickly destroys the understanding of church. Our children desperately need to be taught the basic stories of Holy Scripture and to love and grow their faith. This is something that was done in ALL aspects of a child's life several generations ago. However, there's no more prayer in school, rarely prayer at the table before eating (either at home or at a restaurant), generations of families who never go to church... it's no wonder younger generations have no desire to make worship a priority in life.

You may ask what to do? Make a change! One hour a week at church will make a serious impact on how our children understand church and faith. IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to bring them to the house of the Lord! Our teachers are ready to make this time of learning a wonderful experience... and don't forget the adult class has a lot of fun learning and discussing their faith (usually with coffee and a nice snack)! For children to be admitted into confirmation class, they must have competed the pre-confirmation class during Sunday School, serve as an acolyte, and complete the first communion program in the year before confirmation classes begin. If your child is nearing this age, you must consult with me before the beginning of the new academic year.

Here you will also notice an invitation to join our sisters and brothers at St. Paul's in Millersburg as they celebrate the 25th anniversary of the ordination of The Rev. Mark A. Hoffman, STS, my friend and colleague. The combined programs that we've begun together have been a wonderful addition to our life of faith. Luke 10:17 - 24 The 72 return (The Lutheran Study Bible, pages 1734-1735)

Verse 18 "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven." Satan fell from heaven as a result of the eaching of Jesus' disciples. When a person knows God has forgiven his sins and becomes a member God's kingdom, Satan is no longer in a position to charge that person with sin. He can no longer and before God's throne; rather, God throws him out. That is what Jesus saw happening as the 72 ant out to preach. (Note: This verse helps us understand Revelation 12:10.)

- 1. Over what did the disciples rejoice?
- 2. Jesus affirmed their joy. But he reminded them about an even greater joy they should always have in their hearts. What is that?
- 3. Why did Jesus thank his heavenly Father for hiding the truths of the kingdom from the wise and learned and revealing them to little children?
- 4. Review the teaching of election, or predestination. How is that taught in verse 22? What comfort does this give you?
- 5. Jesus said that nothing would harm the disciples as they went about doing their work. What about us today? Does Jesus' promise still apply?
- 6. In what way are we more blessed than the people in the Old Testament?
