Grace and peace be unto you from the Lord Jesus Christ,

It has been over 40 years since this congregation has broken ground on any major project, and thanks be to God, on Sunday Oct. 27th we broke ground for the addition to the church building made possible only by the bequest of David and Erla Gerhard. This new entrance will finally enable those who have difficulty to enter the fellowship hall without steps and provide a more beautiful image of this side of the church. The overall plan has been to improve the look of this entrance area since most people park in the lot and not on the street. With the new roof over the sacristy door, the enclosure of the old kitchen entrance, and now the beginning of the ramp we will have a completely new look on the church facing the lot.

Although it may look like all these building projects are happening at once it is a great joy to say that all of these have been on our long-term list just waiting for funds. Not one penny from the general fund has made this possible. All this work comes from the estate of David and Era who generously remembered the church in their estate plans and planned for us to have 50% of their estate. Almost all of the projects would still be on a long list without these funds.

November is usually the time when we talk about stewardship in some way or another. Our Lord spoke about these things often and so must we. Tithing seems to have become an antiquated process that gets no attention anymore and giving is based more on what spare change we have than any planned amount. We often forget that NOTHING we have is truly ours, but rather we are merely stewards of what God has given to our management. In the state we find agencies and centers that attempt to fill the gaps where the church used to be in complete control – helping the poor, the needy, the widows and the orphans. Now we focus more on budgets and control than we do on freely giving to those who will find blessing in our actions! There is so much more that could be done for those who do not yet know the love and compassion of Jesus Christ and yet without the giving needed to function as a church much goes undone. We must train ourselves to be good stewards of all that we have been given... our money and possessions, our time, our health and most importantly our souls.

If you are looking for just one way to make a huge difference, I charge you to plan something in your life in all of these areas of stewardship, but most of all... reach out to just one person. That is the charge of the Gospel of all people, not just me as your pastor, but of *everyone*. Is it easier to just put another bill in the envelope? Yes. Is it easier to simply join a group at church and give a little time? Yes. Is anything more rewarding that to see the faith of someone you care about enlivened by the word, song, body and blood of Christ? NO! It will be inconvenient. It will be uncomfortable. It will take all of your patience. It will surprise you with JOY!

For the sake of Christ our Lord, to whom you have promised your faith and life, go... go and at least seek out someone to be made a disciple. By your love and friendship, your guidance and your faith... you will see that you have already done more than sought out, but truly MADE disciples of the Lord you love.

May the joy and love of Christ enter your home, your family and your life this season, and amidst the inconvenience of the world I know that I will see you here in this place to give thanks!
