


From the desk of Pastor Nathan:

Dear friends, we have enjoyed the brilliance of the Christmas Star and I pray that you have seen the Incarnate Jesus who came so that you might live abundantly. Our celebration of Christmas was full of joy and excitement this year and so many worshippers gathered here for Christmass Eve and Morning! So quickly, however, our calendar changes and time moves forward. Now, on the very edge of Lent, we adjust our lens and prepare to meet the Lord in more ways and for all the same reasons. We need forgiveness and grace, for each day of our lives, and in every situation. The same Lord Jesus, incarnate as a child, preaches, teaches, and heals in so many ways, and in miraculous beauty He suffers, dies, and in that same flesh, rises again from the tomb! In all these ways Jesus offers the same forgiveness for each season of life. So precious then is our access to that very flesh and blood at His Holy Supper! When we begin to make real in our lives the understanding of this true body and blood, we begin to recognize that real presence in new ways. We're no longer separated from the Jesus who walked upon the Sea of Galilee, or the Jesus who walked the difficult pathway to the cross of Calvary. Guarding the fragile souls of those in distress, praying for and anointing the sick, burying the dead, baptizing and confirming those new to the faith, preaching, teaching, and presiding at the Eucharist all describe what a pastor does. Yet it is the work of us all as a congregation. I'm so happy to have immeasurable assistance here to make sure the work of this congregation is effective. However, I still need your prayers, along with those of the Saints of old, the voices of those who pray do not go unheard. Our staff here is able and willing to help in all situations! In my absence Ken, Chris, and Sharyn are available to make sure our congregational needs are met. Please keep them informed of hospital stays and other needs so that the appropriate response can be made.

As for travel, pray for me and the 42 pilgrim ministers who will be experiencing the Holy Land for the first time! It is such an honor to be part of the leadership of the Knights Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage, and this 3rd pilgrimage of mine is sure to be just as exciting as the first. I will remember you as I walk where Jesus walked! Thank you to Ken who will preach and lead a service of the Word, and for The Rev. Patrick Rooney, Senior of the STS who will lead Mass. 

Blood Pressure Screenings continue during Fellowship each month, get your blood pressure checked!

Health Ministry Team volunteer assistance continues to provide our parishioners with rides to appointments, delivery of meals upon returning home from a hospital stay, and visitations. If you know of a fellow parishioner in need of this service, please let a team member know.

Hats, gloves, shoes, underclothing and more were collected for the children at the Upper Dauphin Schools. Thank you to everyone that donated. These items were delivered to the schools December 19th before the Christmas break. The guidance counselors distributed these items to children in need.



The **CPR class** planned for this year is cancelled, as there is not enough interest. Unless Sharyn receives at least ten people committed to CPR training, this will be tabled until next year. Next year, those who are already certified, will be re-certified.

Our **Health Ministry display** has many interesting articles and health information available. Please feel free to take anything that interests you. A small donation is suggested, but <u>NOT required</u>. We will add additional information as it becomes available. If there is something of interest to you, please let us know.

We have entered the winter months with **illnesses in the air**. Remember when you sneeze to NOT sneeze into your hand but rather sneeze into your elbow/arm. By sneezing in this manner, you are preventing the spread of germs from your hand to the person or persons you then touch. If you do accidently sneeze into your hand, use hand sanitizer to cut down on germs or wash your hands with soap. We all need to take part in preventing the spread of virus and bacterial infections.



HEALTHY MINUTE/SAFETY MINUTE

When is it time to seek medical care?

Do I have a cold/virus or something more like a bacterial infection? The first signs of a **VIRUS**: achiness, coughing, running nose, congestion, no fever, clear or yellow tinged mucous.

BACTERIAL: same symptoms but also with: fever, yellowish-greenish mucous, congestion to the point of getting short of breath or not able to get comfortable when laying down to sleep. Tip 1: look at your nail beds, when you push down on your nail bed, if it springs back to the same color within 3 seconds, you're getting enough oxygen and you're hydrated. However, if you look at your nailbeds and they are bluish/dusky or not springing back in 3 seconds, you need medical care. Tip 2: Consider your eyes; (via mirror) pull down your lower eyelid. If it's nice and pink, your hydrated, good job! However, if you pull down your lower eyelid and its white you are dehydrated and need to get some fluids in you. Good hydration when not feeling well consists of Gatorades which add fluid and flavor to help you. If you have a queasy stomach, drink ginger ale, the ginger will help to settle your stomach. Try some hot tea with honey, which will help with your stomach and congestion.

Safety Minute: We are in the season when people try many alternatives to try and stay warm during the winter months. As a result, fires occur which can be devastating and cause the loss of life. With the use of **SMOKE DETECTORS** in our homes, we can <u>significantly eliminate</u> the loss of life. The replacement of batteries is necessary to have a functioning alarm and this can be quite trying for some people.

Our Health Ministry has obtained smoke detectors.

If you know someone that needs a smoke detector, *please take one!* If you know of someone that needs the batteries changed and is unable to change them, please let a team member know, as we have people in the congregation *willing* to provide this assistance.

Your parish nurse is available for additional questions or concerns.




