Grace and peace be unto you from our Lord Jesus Christ!



This is a most exciting time to be writing to all of you. At this point Sunday School has resumed and the adult class has resumed our study of a Biblical Walk Through the Mass. If you have ever wondered about the scriptural historicity of the Mass, this course is for you! The teen class is meeting in the small room in fellowship hall with Ken and has begun Bible reading and study programs, and the children have returned to their exciting work with biblical stories, crafts, snacks and fun!

I thank you for all your prayers and words of encouragement while in Boston at school this summer. The program is going well and I'm enjoying doctoral study more as each course comes and goes. This semester we are studying activism and leadership, and specifically examining the African-American culture. As mentioned at the Ice Cream Social, Ken Campbell has begun online studies at the Josephinum located in Ohio. His beginning work in theological study will support well his teaching here at Salem. I encourage you to engage him in conversation about his work, and support him on this journey of faith and learning.

Having just returned from the General Retreat of the Society of the Holy Trinity at St. Mary of the Lake Mundelein Seminary in Chicago, I remind you of the richness of our ministerium and invite you to join us at local retreats. On December 5-6 at Danville (where the women's retreat is held) the Susquehanna Chapter will meet in study and prayer. We begin at noon on Monday and conclude at noon on Tuesday. You may enjoy the entire retreat with us, or any portion thereof. There are always visitors from our congregations in attendance, and I assure you that it is an enjoyable time with prayer, preaching, study and fellowship.

As we prepare to enter the Advent Season I urge you to consider your commitment to Christ. Start now preparing a space for worship in the busy season that is nearly upon us. In a joint worship experience Salem & St. Paul's Lutheran Churches will worship together on each Wednesday in Advent at 7pm. See the schedule on pg 12, and plan on exciting time with our sisters and brothers at St. Paul's. Our theme will be "The Body of Christ."

Simon was surnamed the Zealot for his rigid adherence to the Jewish law and to the Canaanite law. He was one of the original followers of Christ. Western tradition is that he preached in Egypt and then went to Persia with St. Jude, where both suffered martyrdom. Eastern tradition says Simon died peacefully at Edessa. His feast day is October 28th. At least one lamp is to be kept burning day and night before the tabernacle in which the Blessed Sacrament is kept.

St. Jude, known as Thaddaeus, was a brother of St. James the Less, and a relative of Our Saviour. He was one of the 12 Apostles of Jesus and his attribute is a club. Images of St. Jude often include a flame around his head, which represent his presence at Pentecost, when he accepted the Holy Spirit alongside the other apostles. Biblical scholars agree St. Jude was a son of Clopas and his mother Mary was the Virgin Mary's cousin.
