May is National Stroke Awareness Month - Act FAST!!!

Do you know that a person experiencing a stroke can be treated if people act **FAST**? 80% of strokes can also be prevented. **FAST** is the acronym for things to check in a suspected stroke victim:

F - Face Does the face droop on one side when

the person smiles?



A - Arm After raising both arms, does one of the arms drift downward? Or is the person unable to

lift their arm?



S - Speech After repeating a simple phrase, does the person's speech sound slurred or strange? Or, are they unable to articulate words?

T - Time If any or all the above are observed, call 9-1-1. When a person is experiencing a stroke, time is critical for medication to be given within 60 minutes of the onset of a stroke.

A stroke is a "brain attack" which is caused by the interruption of blood flow usually due to a blood clot. A Hemorrhagic stroke is the result of bleeding or rupture of a blood vessel in the brain. Strokes are the fifth leading cause of death in the United States. Every year 800,000 people will experience a stroke and every four minutes someone will die from a stroke. This is an illness that has no age discrimination; all ages can experience a

stroke, young and old!

Blood Pressure screenings are available to everyone during Fellowship each month.

The 10 most common signs and symptoms of a stroke:

- 1) Trouble seeing-blurred vision, loss of vision
- 2) Loss of balance, having trouble sitting down without falling
- 3) Difficulty speaking
- 4) Weakness in arms or legs
- **5**) Facial paralysis, when smiling only one side of face moves
- 6) Pain a pain that just won't go away
- 7) Confusion
- 8) Severe headaches, people have described these headaches to the degree of feeling like their head was going to burst
- 9) Altered senses with loss of taste or loss of smell
- **10**) Fatigue caused by the bodies irregulating of hormones due to the stroke.

HEALTH MINISTRY CONT'D.

June is National Men's Health Month

The purpose of Men's Health Month is to heighten the awareness of preventable health problems and encourage early detection and treatment of disease among men and boys. Regular checkups and age-appropriate screenings CAN improve your health and reduce premature death and disability.

Having a yearly **physical exam** and blood pressure check is the first step for your physician to determine if you may have a health issue that needs further evaluation. Routine bloodwork and urinalysis should be done every 2-3 years depending on your age. Electrocardiogram should be performed at age 30 as a baseline reading and then repeated every two years to detect any changes. Tetanus shots need to be given every 10 years to prevent these serious and lifethreatening effects. Prostate screening with PSA blood testing should be done at age 50 and then yearly for early detection of prostate cancer. Hem occult stool testing should be done at age 40 to detect blood in the stool and possible health complications. At age 50 a colonoscopy should be performed and followed up every 5-10 years based on physician recommendation. Routine chest x-ray should be done at age 50 for early detection of lung disease or cancer. If person is a smoker, chest x-ray should be performed at age 45. Every male should do monthly selfexams: Testicle: To find lumps in their earliest stages. Skin: To look for signs of changing moles, freckles, or early skin cancer. Oral: To look for signs of cancerous lesions in the mouth. Breast: To find abnormal lumps in their earliest stages. Bone mineral density testing should be done at age 60 to determine for osteoporosis, risk of bone fracture. Men over the age of 40 should have their testosterone level checked, as low levels decrease sex drive, erectile dysfunction, fatigue, and depression. This test can be done with a simple blood test. Men who are sexually active with more than one partner should be tested for sexually transmitted diseases.

Health Ministry Team Volunteers provide rides to appointments, visits, meals when returning home from the hospital, etc. We are looking for additional volunteers. This group takes turns providing these services to parishioners and they pick the days they can help. If you feel you would be able to help provide these services to our church family, please see Sharyn or Pr. Nate.



Perhaps the voice of the Good Shepherd is saying have faith; faith that I am with you, faith that I will guide you, faith that I will protect you, if you but hear my voice. I like to believe that when we really begin to listen to the voice of Christ (and we have faith that we are really listening) we can grow as Christians who can truly carry the good news to others. Surely we want to call ourselves part of the flock of the Good Shepherd. Especially because of the promises of support, guidance, protection and love that come with this belonging. Think about some of these questions... If we had directions from the Jesus Christ the Good Shepherd that were as clear as the morning news or the email at work would we follow His voice as blindly as many follow those human directions? Listening to Christ is a way of living. But, how can we possibly make the distinction between listening and hearing? Even though the voice is there for us do we even recognize it sometimes? Do we need to train ourselves to hear the voice? Seriously, if we were to teach our children how to shepherd others perhaps our future would be a lot more caring, loving, and supportive. We must all learn how to protect others, love others, and include others...no matter what may make them seem different. Our Lord himself reminds us that there are MANY who will join his flock.
