January is Cervical Cancer Awareness Month

Human papillomavirus (HPV) is a common infection that spreads through sexual activity, and it causes most cases of cervical cancer. Women can protect themselves from this infection and disease by receiving the HPV vaccine.

There are approximately 79 million Americans with HPV and don't know they are infected until the signs and symptoms of complications such as pain, fatigue or loss of appetite present themselves. Cervical cancer can be prevented with regular screening tests and follow up care. Women get your yearly exams. Cervical cancer screenings can detect abnormal cells early before they turn into cancer.

February is Heart Disease Awareness Month

Heart disease is the leading cause of death for men and women in the United States. Every year 1 in 4 deaths are caused by heart disease. The good news is that if people make good healthy choices these numbers can be reduced.

Taking charge of our life and health by using spices to season food instead of salt, reduces the added pressure put on the heart to pump that excess fluid out of your body that is being retained due to your increased salt intake.

Take a walk every day or at the very least get up and walk around several times a day versus sitting all day. Inactivity has been proven to shorten your lifespan, so get up and move. Watch your weight, quit smoking, if you drink do it in moderation and control your cholesterol and blood pressure.
